- Records and transcripts given to receiving school even if fees are not paid
- Resolving school placement disputes –student must remain in his or her school of origin while dispute is being resolved

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CADDO PARISH SCHOOL BOARD FOSTER CARE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

New requirement under Title I Part A highlights the need to provide educational stability for children in foster care, with particular emphasis on collaboration between SEA's, LEA's, and Child Welfare agencies to ensure that students in Foster Care have the opportunity to achieve at the same high level as their peers.

These provisions emphasize the importance of limiting educational disruption. They do so by keeping children who move in foster care in their school of origin, unless it is determined to be in their best interest to change schools.

These provisions also ensure that if it is not in their best interest to remain in their school of origin, children in foster care are enrolled in their new schools without delay.
